Caring, one client at a time... Jessica* called and made an appointment

after taking a home pregnancy test and reading the results as positive. She stated that she was not ready to be a mom and couldn't afford to have a baby at this time. She was stunned by the possibility of being pregnant and appeared scared and alone upon arrival. After filling out paperwork, Jessica was directed to one of our counseling rooms where her patient advocate began the process of connecting with Jessica, building trust, and getting to know her as Jessica began to share her story.

Since Jessica requested medical services, one of our nurses administered a pregnancy test and an ultrasound to confirm a viable pregnancy. Our staff spent considerable time discussing her pregnancy options, the milestones of her baby's development, and the center and community resources available to her. When Jessica left the center that day, she was undecided —no

longer thinking about abortion as her only pregnancy option—and was visibly less stressed, even smiling.

Our staff continued to keep in touch with Jessica by phone and eventually learned that she had decided to continue her pregnancy. She is now enrolled in our Earn While You Learn program and is preparing for motherhood.

A Peek into a Peer Counseling Session...

"I can't continue this pregnancy." "I couldn't afford another child." "I'm not ready to have a baby." These statements were made by some of the women that have sought services from us this year. Most of the women that we see intend to continue their pregnancy. Many enroll in our Earn While You Learn education program in order to prepare themselves for motherhood. But for some of our clients facing an unexpected pregnancy, they can't see a way forward because their sight is obscured by fear. These are the women that our peer counselors are especially called to serve, and do so with compassion and humility. Each story is different and that is where the counseling session begins—helping her feel comfortable and safe so that she will open up about herself and her



situation. By asking appropriate and thoughtful questions, our peer counselors seek to gain insight into her thoughts and feelings; her support systems; her relationship with the baby's father; her spiritual beliefs and how they impact her decision making. The process of building a trusting relationship with her is not hurried—it takes time. The first session will often last two to three hours. This usually includes a pregnancy test, limited obstetrical ultrasound and consultation with a nurse as well as peer counseling with a patient advocate.

As the session continues, she will most likely want to discuss her pregnancy options. This is an opportunity for the peer counselor to sensitively communicate the truth about abortion, parenting and adoption. When working with an abortion-vulnerable woman, the peer counselor shares what happens during an abortion procedure; the inherent risks an abortion poses to her; the estimated stage of development of her baby; the hope and courage she can find in God, and the wealth of resources and support that is available to her through the center and community.

Patient Advocates Needed

Have you considered getting involved with the pregnancy center but up until now the timing has not been right? Maybe you've felt inadequate about yourself, thinking that you wouldn't have what it takes to be a peer counselor to a woman facing an unplanned pregnancy. On the other hand, maybe you've experienced an unplanned pregnancy or had a daugh-

ter who did. During that difficult time for you and your family, you didn't know how your family would get through what, at the time, seemed like a mountain of confusion, fear and

uncertainty. In either case, we want you to know that if God calls, He will equip. For some of you. He has already prepared you to comfort someone facing an unplanned pregnancy because you have been there and experienced it first hand. You've been comforted by God and are now in the best position to share the comfort you've received with someone in need

of it. Others of you, God has given you a heart of compassion for women that are hurting and who need to feel and hear of the love that God has for them.

Currently, we are in need of volunteer Patient Advocates. We are looking for women who are followers of Jesus Christ, who love people with compassion and unconditional acceptance. You must be able to sign-off on our Statement of Faith and Code of Christian Conduct and be committed to the sanctity of human life as well as God's plan for human sexuality. You must exhibit strong interpersonal skills, be willing to be trained and sense God's calling to come alongside women facing an unplanned pregnancy to offer God's love, hope, help and guidance.

If you sense God is calling, He will equip you! We'd love to hear from you.

Peer Counseling... The counselor will also seek to diffuse the reasons, often driven by fear, the client has given for considering abortion. "Fear is never a good counse-

lor." The peer counselor will help the client slow down and consider all of her options and have her ask herself questions like: "What will my life look like if I parent this baby? Who will help? What will my life look like if I choose adoption? An open adoption? What will my life story look like if I choose abortion? Will I be able to have chil-



dren later? Will this really make my boyfriend stay and love me? Will I regret my decision?" As the session draws to an end, the client usually gives the peer counselor permission to follow-up with her in a few days to see how she is doing and to pray over her before leaving the center.



Our Goal - 100 Households!!


